We are seeking to appoint a subject enthusiast to join and contribute to our highly committed mathematics department to teach Math from KS3 through to High Level GCSE, from Easter Term 2020.

Maplewell Hall is a special school for students with moderate learning difficulties and Autism aged 11 – 19 years. At present there are 235 students on roll across the whole school. (195 students in the Main School aged, 11-19 and 40 students with our MAP provision aged 11-16). MAP provides personalised learning for students with high functioning Autism and is designed to support students in reaching their full potential.

Working with all our students at Maplewell is both rewarding and challenging. We have a strong academic ethos and high aspirations for our students who are extremely well motivated. In recent years 100% of pupils, sitting GCSE, have achieved 1 to 9 grades.

Our highly qualified team of staff work together to develop students' confidence, academic and practical life skills, preparing them for life after school. Our teaching rooms are well resourced with interactive whiteboards and our teachers are encouraged to utilise technology in the delivery of the curriculum.

The successful candidate will have the ability to challenge students as well as encourage and support the less able in order to ensure that all students reach their potential. Our teachers are expected to work to the highest professional standards and to be prepared to give individual help and support to students where required.

Members of the mathematics department work as a team when preparing materials and common tests; sharing resources and ideas is a strong feature of the department. We aim to assist each individual to maximise the quality of their teaching and their career aspirations. Regular department meetings, INSET, lesson observation and Performance Management Reviews all form part of this process.
